A LOCAL grammar school has raised a fantastic sum of money for their centenary charity.

Cambridge House recently presented Struggle Against Muscular Dystrophy (SAM) a cheque for £3,612.86.

SAM is a charity set up by former Cambridge House pupil, Tracy McCausland to fund research into the condition in the hope of find-

ing a treatment and cure after her son, Sam, was diagnosed with the condition.

Tracy's enthusiasm and drive have seen it take off and local celebrities James Nesbitt and Emma-Louise Johnston have thrown their weight behind the campaign.

In 18 months SAM has raised well over £100,000, and this will go towards the study into CMD, as well as part-fund the setting up of the world's first MD patient database.
